Report from VP – Participation

SWDSI has a Campus Representative Program where members assist in promoting DSI and SWDSI membership as well as conference participation. Currently, there are 20 SWDSI campus representatives, however, Pamela Rogers (VP for Participation) welcomes volunteers for this program. Campus representatives are a grass roots effort to help identify and attract new members. The primary responsibility is to be a liaison between SWDSI and your colleagues and graduate students. Campus representatives help disseminate information about the call for papers and conference submission process. In the coming weeks, the VP for Participation will be reaching out to past conference attendees to recruit campus representatives for universities with no current representative. Also, let her know other ways you would like to participate (track chair, session chair, committees, board member, etc.) and she will pass that on to the appropriate officer or committee chair.

Whether you renew DSI membership during the year or when registering for the DSI annual meeting, make sure you indicate your primary regional affiliation as SWDSI. It is critical for our members to check the SWDSI box when paying DSI membership dues. This is the only official way to maintain your SWDSI affiliation. The DSI Home Office collects and disseminates information based on who checks that box. This includes information related to specific regional interests. All SWDSI officers and board members are required to maintain current membership in DSI and participate in SWDSI activities such as the conference and officer/board meetings. DSI members receive a discounted registration rate when registering for the SWDSI conference, so all are encouraged to join DSI to enjoy the benefits of membership and officially be counted.

Competitive Papers. Competitive papers are invited on, but not limited to, the topic areas listed below. All submitted papers will be reviewed by qualified individuals and go through a double blind peer review process. In addition, we welcome the submission of one-page single spaced research abstracts (about 150-300 words). Acceptance of abstracts and papers are subject to final approval by the Track Chairs/Program Chair. Accepted papers and abstracts of authors who have registered for the conference by the close of online registration will be scheduled for presentation at the annual meeting and the presented papers and abstracts will be published in the Proceedings (available on SWDSI website only). Paper submission acknowledges that the author(s) will register for and attend the conference, and personally present the accepted paper at the time specified in the conference program.

Submission Policy. The submission of a paper or abstract means the author certifies it is not copyrighted, has not been accepted for publication in a journal or proceedings, has not been presented or accepted for presentation at a professional meeting, or is not under review currently for a journal or proceedings, or presentation at another professional meeting. Concurrent submission and/or presentation of the same or similar paper at another conference is considered a breach of professional ethics. DSI now has a code of ethical conduct which can be accessed at <https://decisionssciences.org/discover-dsi/governance/code-of-conduct/>.

Program Participation. Paper reviewer and session chairpersons will be needed for the program to be a success. Please contact the Program Chair or one of the Track Chairs by October 1, 2020, if you are interested in serving as a session chair or reviewer. Symposia, tutorials, and workshops on current topics are invited. Please contact the Program Chair concerning these proposals.

Distinguished Paper Awards. Distinguished paper awards will be presented to the outstanding papers.

Student Papers. Up to three cash awards for student papers will be presented. Papers submitted in the student track must be solely of student authorship. Watch the SWDSI website for information about a Doctoral Student Consortium.

Abstracts should not exceed three pages; papers should not exceed 20 pages. The more complete and detailed the submission, the greater its chance for acceptance. Hard copies will not be accepted. The site will open August 1, 2020. 3. Each submission must include a separate title page with the following information: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. title of submission b. type of submission (i.e., Research Paper, Abstract, Proposal-Workshop, Tutorial, Panel, Symposium). c. author(s) d. affiliation(s) e. complete address(es) f. telephone number(s) g. email address of the author(s) h. name of the dean(s) of the affiliate school(s) i. track (or topic) that best fits the submission j. corresponding author 4. Initial papers should follow formatting provided at http://www.swdsi.org/swdsi2021/SWDSI_2021_ProceedingsFormattingInstructions.pdf. Up to 20 pages will be accepted for the initial paper. 5. The main body of the paper, abstract, or proposal must have a title but should not include author name(s). 6. All submissions must be received by October 1, 2020. Acceptance or rejection notifications will be provided by December 1, 2020. Camera-ready submission deadline for the Proceedings is January 7, 2021. 7. A registration fee will be required before papers are accepted by the Proceedings Editor. 8.
