TOPIC: Statistics, Data Mining, and Business Intelligence

For Data Mining (DM) to enable competitive advantages in generating revenue and creating business opportunities, statistical techniques and thinking are important components. While many researchers urge incorporating statistics into DM, they substantially ignore the effect of DM on the development of statistics itself. No study empirically investigates this. Towards this end, this panel will discuss several issues, including:
